The written materials shall be readily accessible to the employees in their work area throughout each work shift.

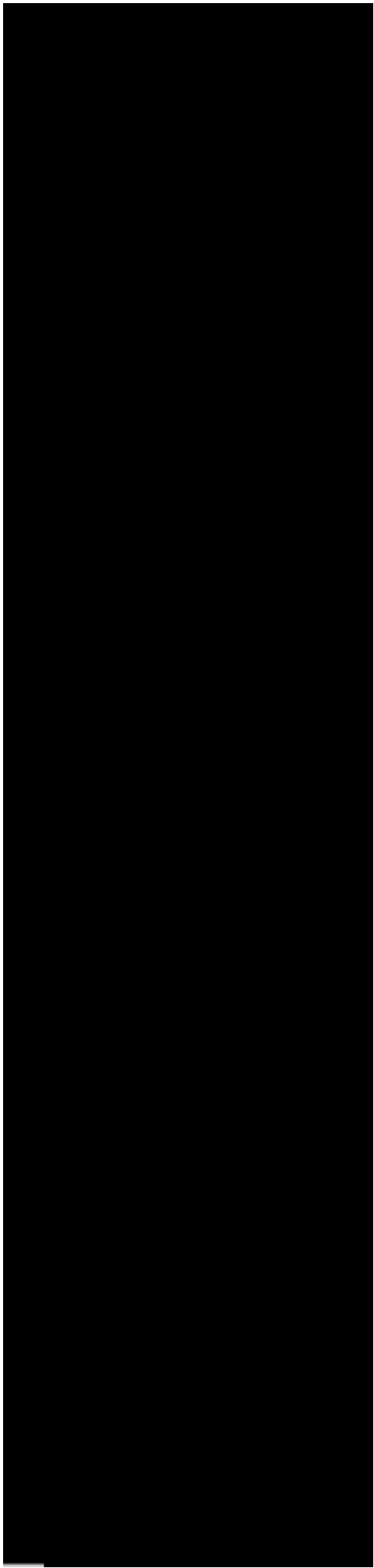
