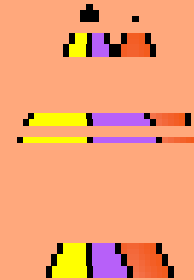


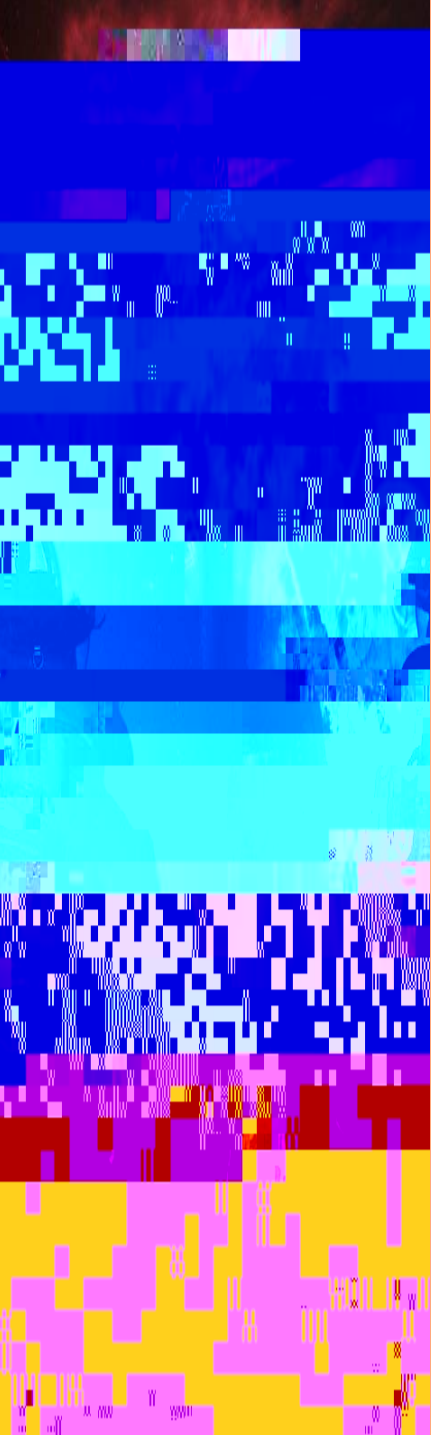

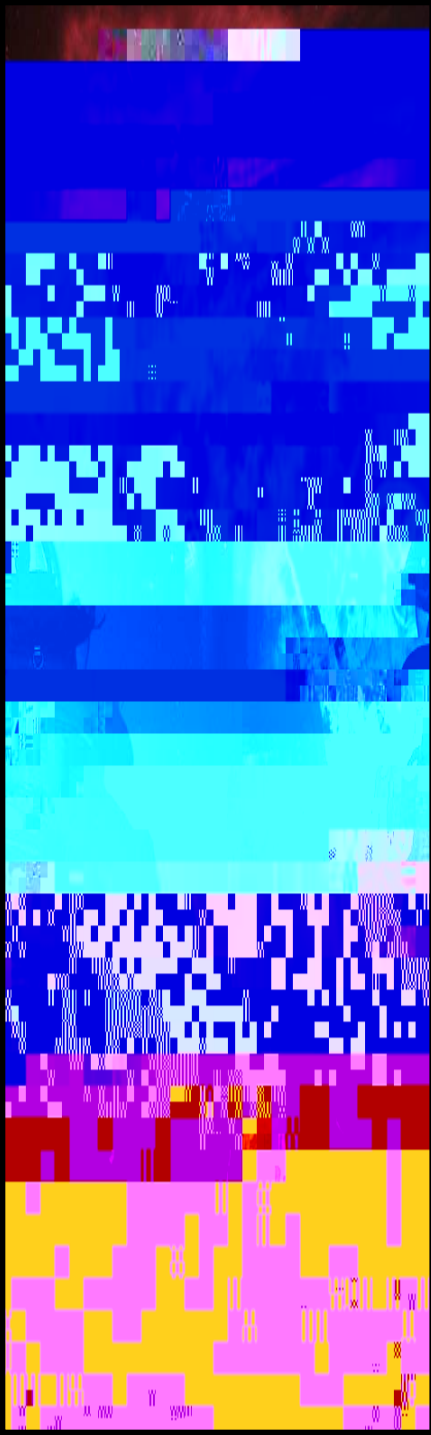
Class of Fires: A

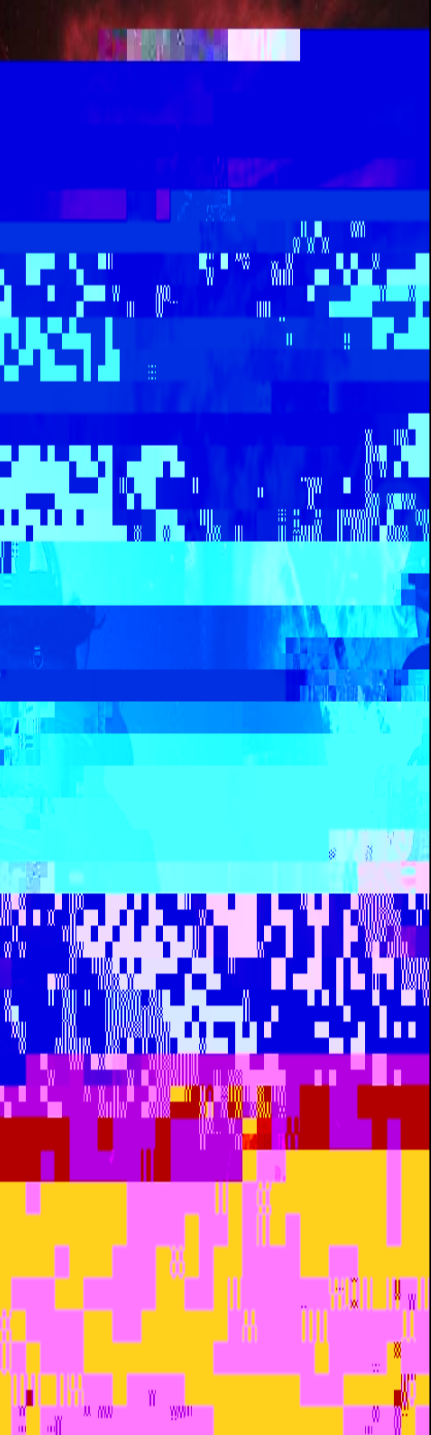
- **Class A** fires involve ordinary

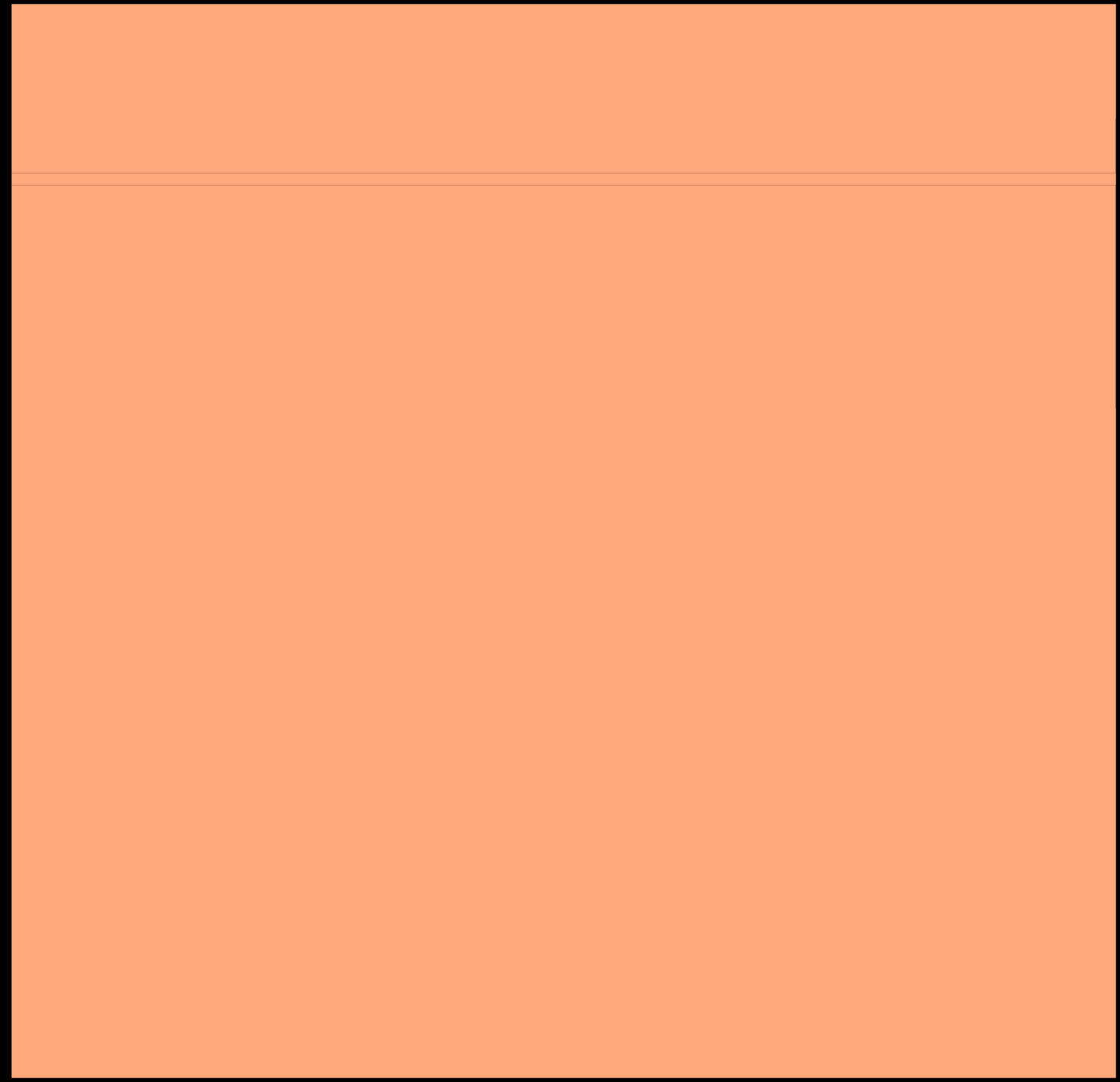
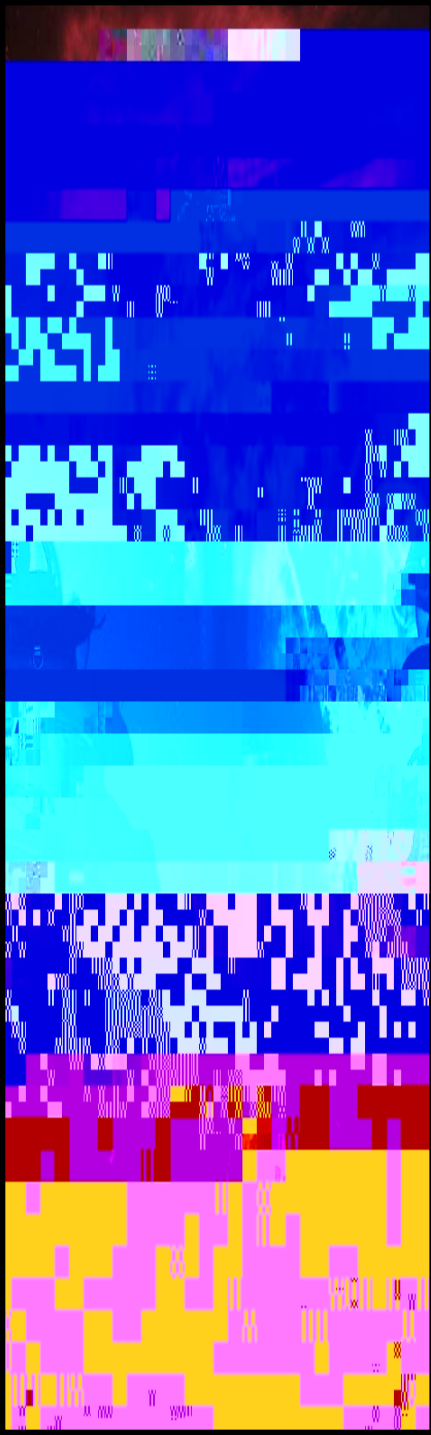


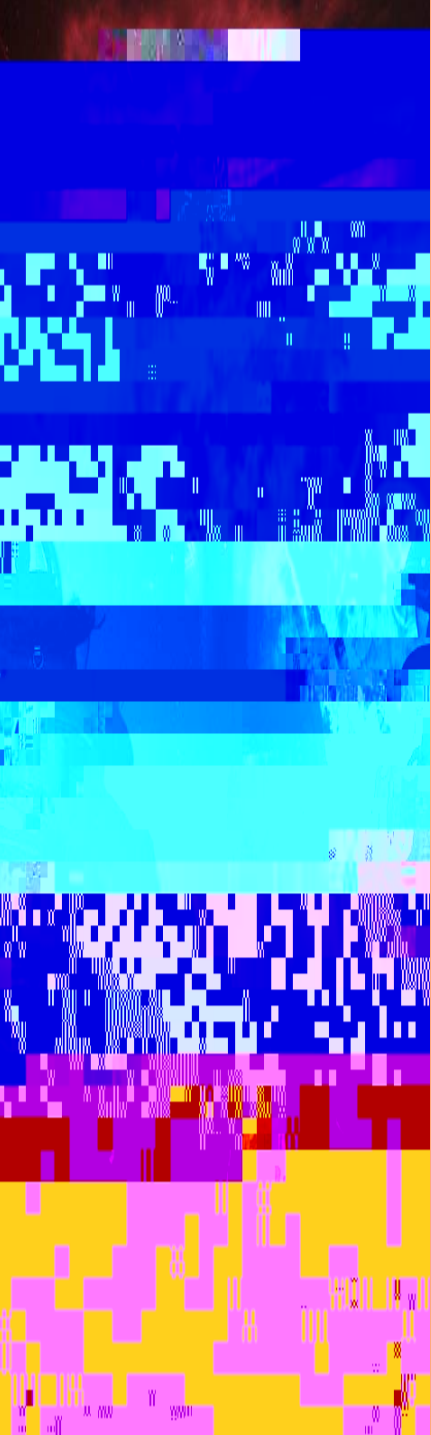
Class of Fires: C

- **Class C** fires involve energized electrical equipment, such as appliances, switches, panel boxes and plug and cord equipment like toasters.
- Remember, Class “**C**” fires involve “**C**ircuits”
- Must be dealt with using $T_m(\bullet)T_j\pi T_5 1 T_f 0.0002$







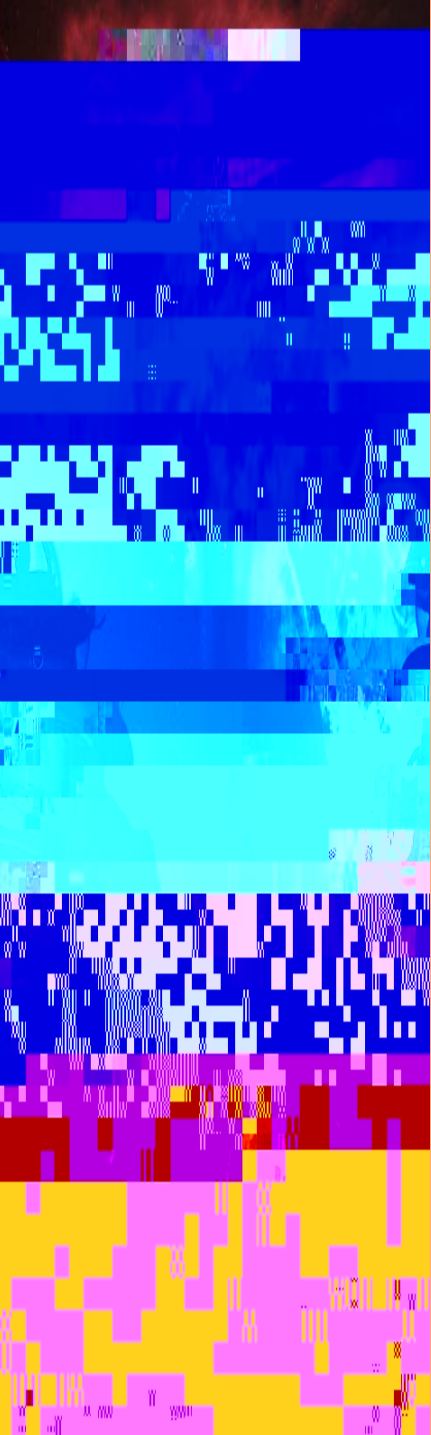


Emergency Action Plan

The EAP must be in writing and must include the minimum :

1. Emergency escape procedures and emergency escape route assignments
2. Procedures to be followed by employees who remain to operate critical operations before they evacuate;
3. Procedures to account for all employees after emergency evacuation has been completed;

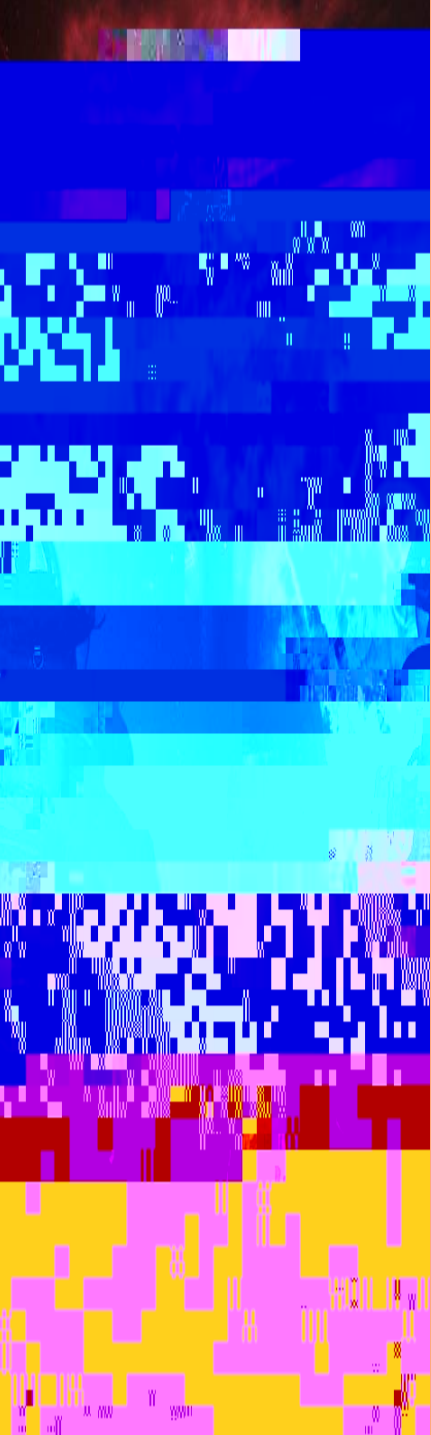
Portable Fire Extinguishers

C. Fire Extinguishers are Provided for Use by Designated Employees Only?

- Exempt from Selection and Distribution requirements.

D. Fire Extinguishers are Provided for Use by Any Employee?

- Must comply with all PFE requirements
