Employee-Owned Equipment

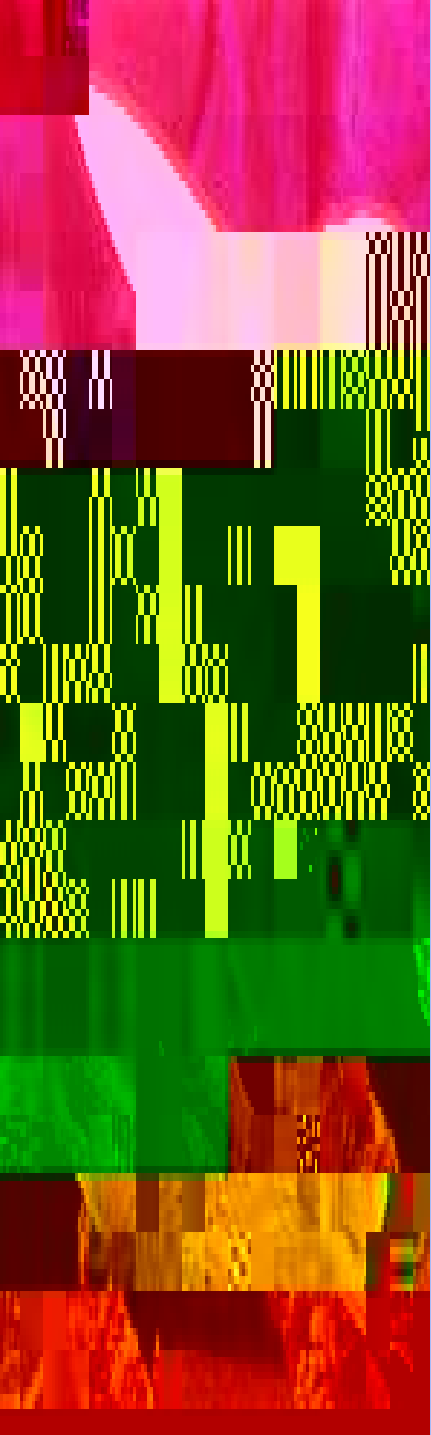
Where employees provide their own protective equipment, **the employer shall be responsible** to assure its adequacy, including proper maintenance, and sanitation of such equipment.

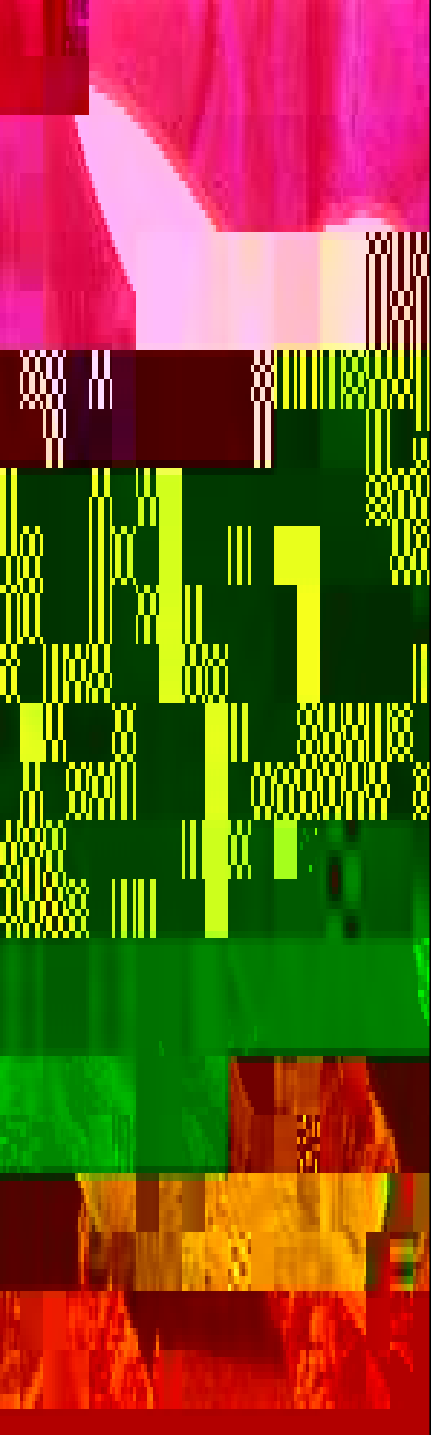

PPE Hazard Assessment

Consideration should be given to these basic hazard categories:

- Impact
- Penetration
- Compression (roll-over)
- Chemical
- Heat
- Harmful dust
- Light (optical) radiation
