Face Coverings Now Required in Public Spaces

Nevada Will Remain in Phase 2 Through the End of July

On June 25, 2020 Nevada Governor Steve Sisolak <u>announced</u> a **mandatory** face covering policy. The <u>directive</u> requires that face masks or coverings must be worn in all public spaces including public facing work environments, and when patronizing businesses or interacting with others in any generally publicly accessible space. The Nevada Medical Advisory Team developed enhanced <u>guidance</u> on when, where and how to wear face coverings.

What does this mean for business owners? As part of the new directive, businesses are asked to establish a "no mask, no service" policy and notices should be posted on doors and in front of your location. <u>Download</u> a printable "No Mask, No Service" poster in <u>English</u>, <u>Spanish</u> or <u>both</u>.

On June 29, 2020 the governor announced that Nevada will remain in Phase 2 of the Nevada United: Roadmap to Recovery <u>plan</u> through the end of July with the added requirement of mandatory face coverings.

Building on the required face coverings requirement to respond to the increase in COVID-19 cases as businesses reopened, the state released the <u>COVID-19 Re-Opening Response Plan</u> on July 1, 2020 which is a targeted and aggressive response to COVID communities most affected.

The plan includes a partnership with the Department of Business and Industry's Division of Industrial Relations (DIR) which has established phone lines, (702) 486-9020 and (775) 688-3700, to take complaints regarding non-compliant businesses. The plan also calls for increased unannounced business surveillance and coordination with chambers of commerce to promote messaging for Nevada businesses.

Reminder: Nevada's Air Quality Permitting Fees Increased on July 1, 2020

If you are submitting a new air quality permit application or a renewal, be aware that fees have increased.
