US Small Business Administration Office of Advocacy Environmental Roundtable on US EPA's Proposed Procedures for Chemical Risk Evaluations Under the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA)

On September 23, 2025, the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued a [proposed rule](#) revising the procedures for conducting chemical risk evaluations under the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA).

Through this SBA Advocacy Environmental Roundtable, US EPA is seeking input on the following issues:

- Whether TSCA necessitates a single risk determination for each chemical evaluated versus a risk determination for each condition of use.
- Whether EPA must evaluate all conditions of use and all exposure routes and pathways in a risk evaluation.
- Whether and how the use of personal protective equipment and engineering and administrative controls in an occupational work environment should be considered.
- Whether regulatory definitions should be broader than TSCA definitions.
- What process should the EPA follow when reconsidering aspects of a risk evaluation.

Public comments on the [proposed rule](#) must be submitted by November 7, 2025.

Updated Guidance on Paper Manifests

US EPA announced it will continue to accept 5-copy paper manifest forms until further notice. EPA was set to transition to a 4-copy manifest form after the [Third Rule's](#) effective date of January 22, 2025. More information on the updated guidance can be found [here](#). A 90-day advance notice will be provided by EPA when they intend to cease acceptance of the 5-copy forms.

SQGs: Did you Re-Notify?

Small quantity generators (SQGs) of hazardous waste are required to re-notify the Nevada Division of Environmental Protection of their generator status every 4 years. The deadline to notify in 2025 was

September 1st. If you are an SQG and your facility has not re-notified, this can be done manually on [EPA Form 8700-12](#) and mailed in to the below address, or it can be done online through [RCRAInfo](#).
